

We thank you for coming out to support your local theatre companies this evening. The magic isn't just the process, but for the joy we hope to bring from the stage.

To my seniors—it seems like just yesterday when you were in seventh grade and I had just had Merin. Where did that time go? Like our rose, it feels like each year is a petal until this moment when you take your last performances on stage. I am excited to see your transformation into the next magical world you step into. Congratulations on a fantastic show and six-year run.

About the Story

Based on the Academy Awardwinning animated feature, the stage version includes all of the wonderful songs written by Alan Menken and the late Howard Ashman, along with new songs by Mr. Menken and Tim Rice.





The original Broadway production ran for over thirteen years and was nominated for nine Tony Awards, including Best Musical. The classic story tells of Belle, a young woman in a provincial town, and the Beast, who is really a young prince trapped under the spell of an enchantress. If the Beast can

learn to love and be loved, the curse will end and he will be transformed into his former self. But time is running out. If the Beast does not learn his lesson soon, he and his household will be doomed for all eternity.



About the Authors



ALAN MENKEN, Music: Legendary composer Alan Menken has created some of the most beloved songs and musical scores of our time. His unique voice, as a composer, a lyricist and a musical theater dramatist has captured the imaginations of audiences for over 35 years. Alan's stage musicals include, The Hunchback of Notre Dame, The Little Mermaid, Sister Act, Leap of Faith, and Newsies. His film musicals include Little Shop of Horrors, The Little Mermaid, Beauty and the

Beast, Newsies, Aladdin (1992 and the 2019 live-action remake), Pocahontas, The Hunchback of Notre Dame, Hercules, Home on the Range, Enchanted, and Tangled. His songwriting collaborators have included Howard Ashman, Tim Rice, Stephen Schwartz, David Zippel, Jack Feldman, David Spencer, Lynn Ahrens, Dean Pitchford, Glenn Slater, Chad Beguelin, and most recently Benj Pasek and Justin Paul for the 2019 live-action film remake of Aladdin. Alan won the 2012 Tony and Drama Desk Awards for his score to Newsies. He currently has more Academy Awards than any other living individual, including four for Best Score (The Little Mermaid, Beauty and the Beast, Aladdin and Pocahontas) and 4 for Best Song ("Under the Sea", "Beauty and the Beast", "A Whole New World" and "Colors of the Wind"). He has earned 11 Grammy Awards (including Song of the Year for "A Whole New

World"), 7 Golden Globes, London's Evening Standard Award, the Olivier Award, the Outer Critics Circle Award, and the Drama Desk Award.

About the Authors Continued

HOWARD ASHMAN, (1950-1991) Lyrics: Best known as a pivotal creative mind behind the renaissance of Disney animation and his work on *The Little Mermaid*, Aladdin and Beauty and The Beast (which is dedicated to, "Our friend, Howard Ashman, who gave a Mermaid her voice and a Beast his soul...") Ashman's first love was theatre. Ashman was a founder of off off Broadway's renowned WPA Theater, where he conceived, wrote and directed God Bless You, Mr. Rosewater, as well as the classic musical, Little Shop of Horrors (both music by Alan



Menken). In 1986, he wrote and directed the Broadway musical *Smile* (music by Marvin Hamlisch). Lamented as a lost treasure of the 1980's theater scene, *Smile* remains popular on High School and College campuses throughout the country. Howard Ashman died in 1991 from complications of AIDS.

TIM RICE, *Lyrics*: Tim Rice has worked in music, theatre, and film since 1965, when he met Andrew Lloyd Webber, a fellow struggling songwriter. Rather than pursue Tim's ambitions to write rock or pop songs, they turned their attention to Andrew's obsession - musical theatre. Their first collaboration, *The Likes Of Us* (lyrics by Tim, music by Andrew), was an unsuccessful show based on the life of Dr. Barnardo, the Victorian philanthropist. Their next three works together were much more successful: *Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat*, *Jesus Christ Superstar*, and *Evita*.



Tim has also worked with other distinguished popular composers such as Elton John (*The Lion King, Aida*), Alan Menken (*Aladdin, King David, Beauty and the Beast*), and Bjorn Ulvaeus and Benny Andersson (*Chess*). He formed his own cricket team in 1973 and was president of the MCC in 2002. In 2013, he wrote and presented a 52-part series for BBC Radio 2, *American Pie*, a trawl through the music and musicians of every American State. He has won several awards, mainly for the wrong thing or for simply turning up.

LINDA WOOLVERTON, Book: Linda Woolverton's writing credits include the screenplay for the animated feature film Beauty and the Beast (Golden Globe winner and Academy Award Best Picture nominee); the screenplay (shared) for Homeward Bound: The Incredible Journey; screenplay (shared) for the animated feature film The Lion King; the book for the Broadway musical Beauty and the Beast (Tony Award nomination for Best Book of a Musical, winner 1998 Olivier Award Best New Musical); and book



(shared) for Elton John and Tim Rice's Broadway musical *Aida*. Also she has written two young-adult novels, *Star-Wind* and *Running Before the Wind*. She holds a Bachelor's degree in Theatre Arts from California State University Long Beach and a Master's degree in Theatre from California State University Fullerton. Linda is currently involved in writing and producing film projects for Miramax and Revolution studios. She lives in Los Angeles with her husband Lee Flicker and daughter Keaton.

About the Directors



VINCENT DORE, *Music Director*: Vincent Dore is a well-established musician, performer, and educator within the Chicagoland performing arts community. Known for his versatility and diligence, Mr. Dore has served the North-Western Indiana area in a variety of positions for nearly a decade. In 2017, he received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Indiana Congress of Parents and Teachers, in recognition of his years of distinguished service in education. In addition to his work as a music educator and vocal coach, Mr. Dore has an extensive performing career as an operatic lyric baritone. He has professionally toured across Europe since 2012, performing in England, Ireland, Scotland, Canada, Italy, and many major cities across the US. He has performed as a guest soloist with a variety of Chicago choirs and has been a featured soloist with The Chicago Theater and The Rosemont Arena. Mr. Dore has dedicated much of his career to working with high-school-aged vocalists, helping them prepare for college auditions, amateur and professional roles, voice contests, and scholarship opportunities.



JIM GRAFF, Set & Technical Director: Mr. Graff has been an art teacher at GHS for 30 years. He graduated from Ball State University with a Bachelor of Science degree in Visual Arts Education. He currently teaches ceramics, 3D Art, and photography. Mr. Graff has been involved with GHS Drama for 22 years as the set director. For the last 12 years he has also taken on the technical director position. Some of Mr. Graff's favorite past productions have been Pirates of Penzance, Little Shop of Horrors, A Funny Thing Happened On The Way To The Forum, and The Music Man. Fun fact: Mr. Graff is also a graduate of Griffith High School.



VIRGINA HERNANDEZ, Pit Orchestra Director: Mrs. Hernandez is thrilled to be a part of the Griffith Theatre Company as the Pit Orchestra Director. She has been involved in musical orchestra pits for over 20 years, including productions of The Music Man, Guys and Dolls, Bye Bye Birdie, Into the Woods, and more. With a BM in Music Education from Bowling Green State University, and a MM in trumpet performance from DePaul University, most of her experience has been as a player, usually playing first trumpet. She also has experience in both conducting and hiring a pit orchestra. With 15 years of experience teaching vocal music, and 20+ years of experience in the band world, she can't wait to direct her third pit as a part of the Griffith Theatre Company.



LAUREN JANUSKA, *Hair & Makeup Director*: Mrs. Januska has had a love for the performing arts her entire life. She started at age three, with dance classes and performing in dance recitals. She continued to dance and eventually became a member of the Gavit High School Woodmar Singers Show Choir, merging her passions of dance and singing. She ultimately found her love for theatre and was the lead role in *Cinderella* and *Scrooge*, inspiring her to take acting courses at Indiana University. During her four years at IU, she was affiliated with the Marching Hundred as a member of the Redsteppers Dance Team. Mrs. Januska also had the incredible opportunity to perform a lead role in the long lived traditional musical-drama competition, *IU Sing*. She is beyond excited to be a part of The Griffith Theatre Company. Working with such talent students and creative directors, she cannot wait to see what the years to come have in store. The future looks very bright!

SARA JONGSMA, Choreographer & Costume Director: This is Mrs. Jongsma's sixth season with The Griffith Theatre Company. She would like to thank the production staff and students for being so warm and welcoming! Mrs. Jongsma has performed and choreographed in numerous musicals in the Chicagoland area with some of her favorite roles being Sad Girl in Bye Bye Birdie (BHUC), Carbuckety in Cats (OLPD) and Purity in Anything Goes (OLPD). This is Mrs. Jongsma's ninth year teaching at GHS after graduating from Ball State with a degree in Family Consumer Science Education and a minor in Musical Theatre Dance. JENNA PARKER, Director: Mrs. Parker started her work in the theatre early with her first performance in Tales of Wonder. When not in the theater, Mrs. Parker spends her time running around with her daughters, Merin & Lily, and spending time with her husband.



JOSEPH RAMOS, Assistant Director: Mr. Ramos was the assistant director for the high school drama production of Anne Frank. Before working in the district, he was a Griffith alumni.
