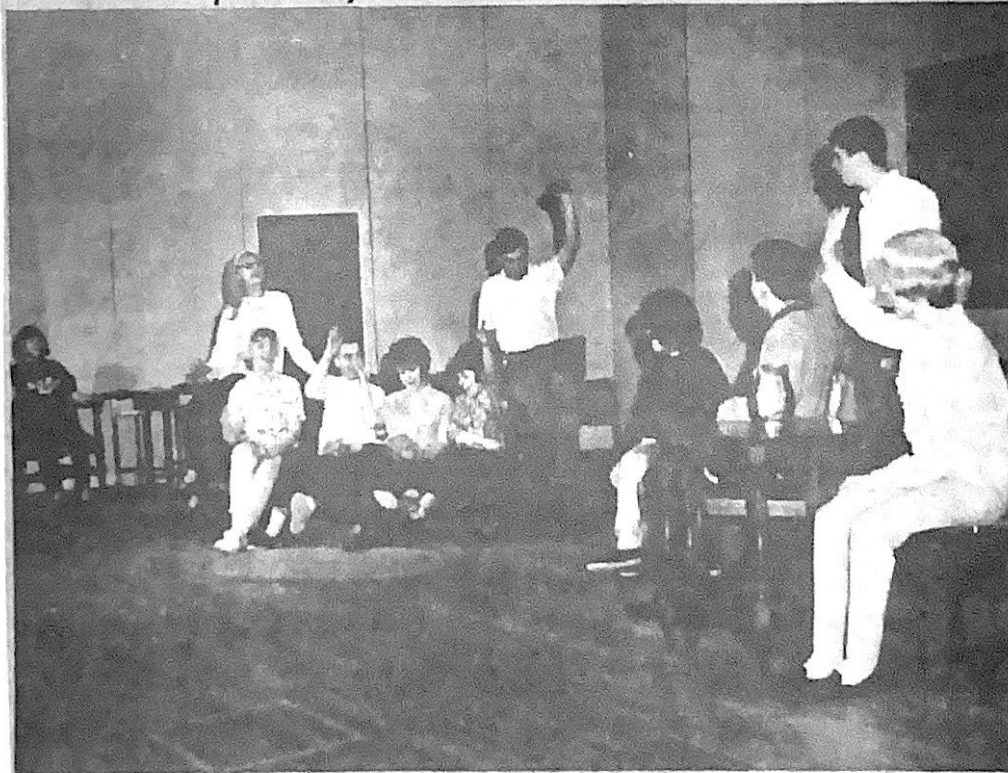
Fred Stawitcke as Dr. Kirkland.
