About The Author

Irish born Protestant Clive Staples Lewis was born in 1898 to an affluent family in Belfast. Lewis, never caring much for school as a child, turned his studies around when he was offered a scholarship to Oxford University in 1916. His education would have to wait when Lewis decided to volunteer to join the British army during WWI. Lewis fought in the battle of the Somme until the last months of war, where he received shell shock and had to be sent home. C.S. Lewis would then return to Oxford to finish his degree before teaching at nearby Magdalen College in Oxford from 1925-1954. He then met Joy Davidman and entered a civil union with her until her death in 1957.

Lewis was an avid poet, novelist, and writer, but his most famous work *The Chronicles of Narnia* stemmed from the destruction and chaos after World War II. Lewis began this seven-part series in 1949, with *The Lion, The Witch, & The Wardrobe*, completing the series in 1954. He would continue to write and teach until his death in 1963.



Background

Probably the most famous of the series, *The Lion, The Witch, & The Wardrobe* tells the tale of four siblings who enter a wardrobe and are transported to the mythical land of Narnia. First written in 1949, at a time where children's literature was just gaining prominence, *The Chronicles of Narnia* became an instant success. This seven-part mythical series would follow the children into different adventures as the books flew off the shelves for over a decade. *The Chronicles of Narnia* continue to be a favorite among children and families alike, with a movie series that debuted in 2005 and a Netflix release of a television show on the series set to debut within the next two years.



Director's Notes

I can vividly remember sitting in my middle school English class reading C.S. Lewis's classic, *The Lion, The Witch, & The Wardrobe*. My best friend and I even tried to do a class project by making Turkish Delight at home (it didn't end well). So, when the time came to pick a fall play, I hoped our cast and crew would find the magic of the story as enchanting as I did as a kid.

Typical tech week rehearsals are actually pretty humorous to watch from my seat in the house. I usually have Miss Rivera next to me, giving great feedback, and painting/constructing all the prop and set pieces needed for show. Banners, shields, swords, you name it and Miss Rivera has worked her magic to get it done and it all comes out beautifully. To my right, Miss Scheidel sits with costume pieces, lengths of fur for animal tails, and wrapping fabric around what will be the bodies for our unicorn and centaur. To see what they come up with in a few short weeks is truly a marvel. Mr. Graff is typically backstage with his crew creating sleighs, beaver dams made out of foam sheets, and the great stone table you will see tonight. Again, work I couldn't' even begin to put together let alone teach students how to do. Finally, Mrs. Januska and Miss Nelson are in our green room with the cast and makeup crew creating the wonderful, mythical creatures that you will see in Narnia. I never feel like it's show time till I see the kids in full costume and makeup.

To those of you in the audience who have come to see us this weekend, we thank you for silencing those phones and for shutting the world out for awhile while we have the pleasure of transporting you to Narnia. We have had fun creating this world, and we hope you enjoy it as well.

To my cast and crew, you have taken this story and truly made it your own. It has been a joy and pleasure to see how far you have all come these past two months. Some of you prior to this show had never stepped foot on stage, used a drill, or picked up a makeup brush and yet here we are. You have all exceeded our expectations and we are all proud of the work you have done. You have all led your way to a successful performance.

For the last six years he has also taken on the technical director position. Some of Mr. Graff's favorite past productions have been *Pirates of Penzance, Little Shop of Horrors, A Funny Thing Happened On The Way To The Forum, & The Music Man.* Fun fact: Mr. Graff is also a graduate of Griffith High School.

Shannon Scheidel, Costume Director: This is her eigth year as Costumer and she has loved working on all the shows, *Little Shop of Horrors, A Funny Thing Happened On The Way To The Forum, The Addams Family,* and *Footloose*, and many many more! She helped with costumes while she was in high school as well. Shannon graduated from Griffith High School in 2003, Purdue University with a Bachelor's in FACS Education in 2007, and Indiana Wesleyan with a Master's in Education with emphasis in Curriculum Development in 2011. This is her 12th year at GHS as Family and Consumer Science teacher. She also is head coach of Cross Country. She is very excited for the show and couldn't have done it without her amazing crew! Lauren Nelson, Hair Director: Miss Nelson started her work in theater during high school with her first performance as Queen Guinevere in *Sir Gawain & The Green Knight*.
